• Equity Walk: An in-person support system that provides direct, comprehensive coaching and professional development to classroom teachers to support culturally responsive teaching. Consultants work with teachers to assist with lesson design plans, instruction, learner strategies, data analysis, and curriculum mapping.



- Introductory Workshop: The workshop provides foundational tenets of equity through cultural proficiency and builds on grounded knowledge in the cultural proficiency continuum; the cultural proficiency guiding principles; the four tools of cultural proficiency; and the barriers to cultural proficiency.
